

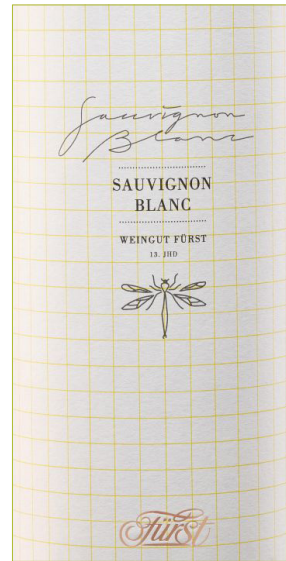


WEINGUT FÜRST

Mosel, Germany

The Obermosel is the southernmost part of the Mosel river, south of the Saar near the border of Luxembourg. Just next door is the Sauer Valley, where Michael Fürst operates his small family winery, and focuses on growing and vinifying wine from the historic Elbling grape, a great old Germanic variety once planted more widely than Riesling in Germany. Today its range is limited to the cool, steep banks of the Obermosel, Sauer, and neighboring Luxembourg.

The Fürst family has grown grapes and other crops at their estate since the 13th century, and Michael is the third generation to make wine under the family name.



Sauvignon Blanc 12/750ml

Single vineyard Sauvignon planted in chalk limestone in the Obermosel, the southernmost part of the Mosel river in Germany, directly bordering Luxembourg. Clear, elegant, cool climate Sauvignon with classic varietal signatures of grapefruit, passionfruit and fresh cut grass. Also, typical of its cool climate: just 12% alcohol. 10g RS lends a nice fruity grace note, but this still drinks DRY. Vegan.
